Over 165 Lots from 18th-20th Centuries Go Up for Bid on November 24

SOUTH SAN FRANCISCO, CA, NOVEMBER 11, 2019 – Turner Auctions + Appraisals is pleased to present the Julianna Southall Glumac Collection, Part II, on Sunday, November 24, 2019 at 10:30 am PST, featuring a diverse and eclectic selection of furniture and decorative arts, mostly from the 18th-20th centuries. Mrs. Glumac was owner and curator of Southall Antiques, one of San Francisco's finest antique dealers for 20 years.

This online auction offers an intriguing array of over 165 lots. Artworks from the 19th and 20th centuries feature oils, watercolors, gouaches, mixed media, ink and lithographs from international artists. Furniture pieces include elegant side chairs and armchairs from the 18th-early 20th century, a 19th-century mahogany dining table, French and Chinese side tables, trumeau and Neoclassical-style mirrors, a seven-panel screen, and two giant clam shells. From Japan are a selection of tansu chests, painted doors and kimonos. From China are cloisonné bowls, lidded jars, cinnabar items, decorative figures, miniatures, and a painting on silk. Other items include sets of decorative pillows; groupings of art glass and paperweights; numerous crystal pieces, including glasses and a chandelier;



desk, table, floor and altar lamps; Oscar de la Renta plates; 19th-century bronze figures and French clock; tableware including Noritake and Haviland; a Meissen ice bucket; vintage rugs; toile items; a miniature sextant; silver plate items; and more. An extensive selection of art and design books and antique volumes are also available. Items from several other collectors round out the sale.



Turner Auctions + Appraisals begins its online auction on Sunday, November 24, 2019, at 10:30 am PST; sale items are available for preview and bidding now. The auction will be featured live on five platforms: LiveAuctioneers, Invaluable, Bidsquare, iCollector, and Turner Auctions + Appraisals' free mobile app, which can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Apps ("Turner Auctions"). Lot 3: Two Japanese wooden doors with scenes of lemurs, signed Amos Shantz, measuring 69 inches high x 30 1/4 side x 1 deep. Estimate \$400 - \$600. (Photo, top right)

Lot 15: A large late 19th- / early 20th-century Meissen blue onion pattern porcelain ice bucket measuring 16 inches high (including handle) and 11 1/2 inches diameter. Estimate \$400 - \$600. (Photo, top left)

Lot 19: Four early- to mid-19th century ebonized side chairs with gilt metal detail, faux leopard cushions. 18 inch high seat, 34 rail, 18 wide x 18 deep. Estimate \$400 - \$600. (Photo, lower right)



Lot 60: Three late 20th- / early 21st-century art glass vases, the smallest signed Manuel dated 2003, and two large vases, one numbered and one signed Satava and numbered. The tallest measures 13 1/2 inches high. Estimate \$200 - \$300. (Photo, lower left)

Lot 5: A 19th-century trumeau mirror with a painting of Napoleon and his troops, measuring 56 1/2 inches high x 26 1/2 wide. Estimate \$300 - \$500. (Photo, top right)



Lot 134: Seven 20th-century Japanese kimonos. Estimate \$400 - \$600. (Photo, top left)

Lot 12: 19th-century bronze figures. Size: 12 inches in height each. Estimate \$300 - \$400. (Photo, lower right)
